Equally at home in the jungle or on the tundra, Jamie is the holder of five World Records.

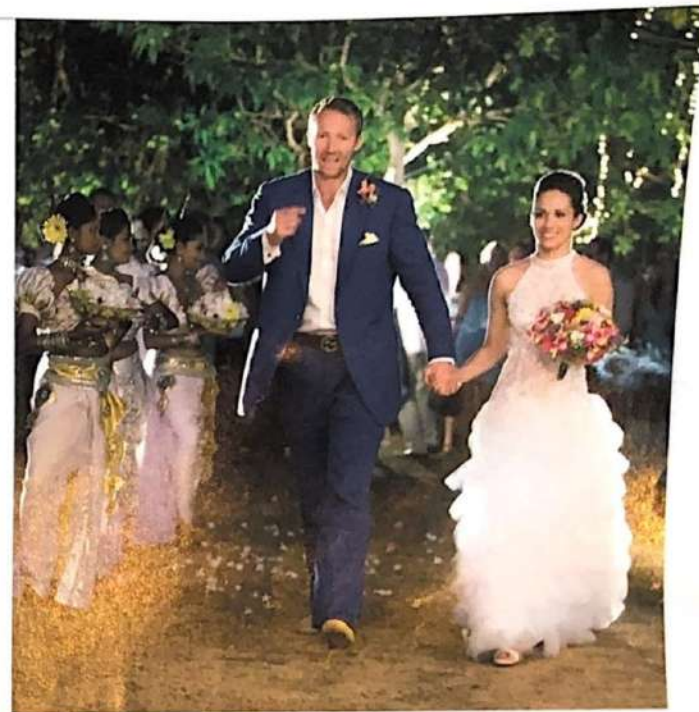
Amongst other achievements, he has rowed the Atlantic and with his 2011 climb and descent of Muztagh
